Prompts:

*the most simple way is to walk a different path

Schedule:

- 11.30am      **Introduction** and coffee / Artur's home (30 Ferry House, Harrington hill, E59HD)
- 12 (midday)      **Collective Walk** to Springfield Park Bandstand: **fieldwork preparation**
- 1pm              Picnic at the Bandstand or nearby café (weather depending)
- 2 to 4pm        **Individual Walks** around Springfield Park / Walthamstow Marshes:  
**fieldwork, documentation.** *We may choose to orient our activity around one or more of the quotes above. Afterwards, we take some time to reflect upon the experience.*
- 4 to 5.30pm      Back at Artur's house:  
**Preparing for recollection / tea break.** You may want to upload on [Google Drive](#) some **preliminary traces** or documentation of your day.  
**Collective recollection.** We gather to share traces, stories and findings. The session is recorded.

We arrive with our experience from previous fieldwork (Blackheath, Ditchling, Folkestone, St Yrieix, de chez soi) or having read Tim Ingold's article "[Footprints through the weather-world: walking, breathing, knowing](#)" (2010)

Afterwards:      End of January; follow up online recollection to share traces  
End of February: Upload on [Google Drive](#) your **finalised traces**  
*images, videos, sound works, field notes, other text, scores etc.* These will be curated for the project website.
